Programmed by Artistic Director Nool permy, this 2021 edition line-up includes an online dance performance, an online Talk and Demonstration session on Chaocian Ethnic Dance nd a Chinese Classical Fan dance masterclass facilitated by ounding Artistic Director Lim Moi Kim.

Chinese Dance Fiesta's dance performances have been reprogrammed from a community touring performance to engage about the control of the positive reviews of its Mid-Autumn production in 2020 that were and first for SCDT to be hosted in the digital space due to the COVID-19 restrictions. The performance attracted new audiences different from its typical audience profile and extending its reads extending to the option of the promotion of Chinese dance beyond Singapore.

This year performance showcases 6 distinct works, featuring gue performers from the 4 Singapore Chinese Dance Theatres' dance troupe and local Chinese dance groups, Wu Yue Dance Studio Troupe, and students from LASALLE College of the Arts.

In seeking t and grow the local Chir In seeking to murture, inspire and grow the local Chinese dance professionals, Nove has been worked closely with students from the local arts institutions. This year, students from the Diploma in "Phase-e Within our control" in collaboration with Nove Jenny. This work expresses how our senses are noted internally, transient through responses. Our mind maps out predictable patterns in our body. It engenders our senses, manipulates our thoughts into movements phase within our control.



Amongst the other dance works, performances to look forwar will be "In Search", choreographed by SCDT's dance artiste, W Zhuo Qin, as well as "Tranquillity" choreographed by SCDT's Creative Director, Benedict Soh.

"In Search" is the first work created by Wong Zhuo Qin for SCDT. This choreography showcasesthe beauty of Tibetan dance, inspired by the poem Little Gidding of T. S. Eliot. Hear the beat of the drums while the dancers twirl and move with the melody of the Tibetan

"Tranquillity" has toured across several provinces in China, receiving recognition from the reviews for its brilliant use of th Chinese water sleeve.
